Junior State ACT test Tues., April 2nd- The results from this test may be used for admissions and scholarships. *Be prepared for this very important test!*

IMPORTANT ACT REMINDERS FOR JUNIORS:

1. Report to your testing room at 7:15am. (Do not go to your regular class.)
2. You will find your assigned seat in the testing room (alphabetical order) and place your **Photo ID** on the desk. If you do not have a photo ID (license, permit, state ID military), your ID letter will be in your testing room (if you had one made in English class.) E-mail Ms. Warren ASAP if you do not have a photo ID and did not get your picture taken for your ID letter warrendb@scsk12.org
3. Bring a **calculator** if you would like to use your own. The school will provide one for the State ACT.
4. Bring two pencils and a snack.
5. You may wear a watch if it does not have an alarm or make any noise.

UPCOMING DEADLINES FOR SENIORS:

April 4 **Graduation Ticket Request form due to Senior English teacher.** Every person regardless of age must have a ticket to enter graduation. Shelby County School employees with a photo ID will not need a ticket.

April 8-12 **Senior Exit Meeting with counselor-** Seniors will meet with the counselor to report colleges where they are accepted and ALL scholarship offers and financial aid information. Seniors request a FINAL TRANSCRIPT, the first final transcript is free and others are \$6. Seniors will verify name spelling for diploma (first name, MI and last name) and Diploma Type (Graduating with Honors, Distinction, Exemplary Designation).

April 13 **Junior/Senior Prom Woodland Hills, 8:00pm-11:00pm. TICKETS ARE ON SALE APRIL 1-5, 8-10TH.**

April 17 Last day to submit scholarship offers for the graduation program. Submit to Mrs. Warren via email or in M212.

SCHOLARSHIPS-Transcripts are free for scholarships. E-mail Mrs. Warren for electronic or paper copy or come by M212.
