## University of Memphis STEM Academy

The University of Memphis will offer a residential summer camp session June 4-16. The purpose of the Tennessee Board of Regions grant is to allow underrepresented high school students to explore STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) fields so that they envision studying those subjects in college. The STEM Academy is open **to students who will be high school sophomores and juniors in Fall 2017**.
