- **SATURDAY, APRIL 14<sup>TH</sup>-7:30am-11:45am-National ACT testing at Bolton-**Students taking this test should bring the following to testing: ACT Admission ticket (printed from online ACT account), Photo ID (or ID letter issued by counselor), acceptable calculator, pencils, watch, snack Remember, you must have your own calculator; the school does not allow you to print on site the day of the test. You must enter testing with the required ID and ACT ticket.

#### **UPCOMING DATES FOR SENIORS**

Due to upcoming testing for 9-11, the senior counselors will begin the end of the year meetings with seniors this week and continue April 16-20.

- April 16-20Seniors request FINAL TRANSCRIPTS in Senior English classes with Mrs. Warren. 1 free others \$6 Seniors<br/>will verify name spelling for diploma (first MI and last name) and graduation program information.
- April 18Seniors who are NOT meeting graduation requirements will be notified via letter in English. Electives will<br/>only be considered if students are lacking 22 total credits. These students are not eligible to receive<br/>graduation tickets until May 16th from noon-2pm or at rehearsal.
- April 21Junior/Senior Prom Woodland Hills, "Great Gatsby", 7 pm 11pm. Ticket sales Mar. 19-23 \$40 each,<br/>April 2-6 \$50, April 9-13 \$60, April 16-18 \$70 each Cash, cashier's check or money order during all<br/>lunches.
- April 26Seniors pick up graduation tickets 7th period. Seniors must be passing ALL required courses and must have<br/>returned signed Graduation Ticket Request form by April 4th in order to be eligible to receive graduation<br/>tickets on this day. Tickets will be held until May 16th from noon-2pm if seniors are failing any required<br/>class OR if senior did not return Graduation Ticket Form. Parents of eligible seniors may pick up<br/>graduation tickets on April 23 & 24, during these times 6:30-7:15am or 1:15-2:00pm in Vice Principal's Office.

## **SENIORS!** Important reminders-PLEASE read carefully.

- Please make sure that your FAFSA includes your parent(s) financial information. There are still 45 seniors who submitted a FAFSA WITHOUT their parents' info. You will not be eligible for financial aid (including the TN Promise) until this information is entered onto your FAFSA.
- Over 140 seniors have been chosen by the Federal Government for a process called "Verification". This means that the schools that you have applied to will ask for you to submit additional financial aid information such as your parent's tax transcript. Your

parent can also link your FAFSA to the IRS by using the IRS retrieval tool on your FAFSA. This will result in a smoother Verification process if your FAFSA is linked to the IRS. You will need to log into y our college student portal and click on the Financial Aid tab for 2018-2019 to see your college's required documents.

• **MAKE SURE THAT YOU ARE PASSING ALL REQUIRED COURSES ON APRIL 18<sup>TH</sup>**. Your grades will be checked and if y0u are not passing a required class, your graduation tickets will be held until May 16<sup>th</sup>.

National ACT test- Regular registration deadline is May 4<sup>th</sup> for the June 9<sup>th</sup> test. Students should register online at <u>http://www.act.org/content/act/en/products-and-services/the-act/registration.html</u>

- Seniors and juniors may check with Mrs. Warren in M212 for fee waiver eligibility.
- Seniors may still take the June and July 2018 tests in order to qualify for the HOPE Lottery scholarship (3.0 unweighted final Grade Point Average OR a 21 ACT score).
- Seniors also must have ACT sub-scores of 18 English and 19 math and reading in order to take college level coursework in the fall. You may also take a placement test during orientation to test out of developmental coursework.
- **JUNIORS! Take the ACT at least <u>three times</u> before December 2018.** The ACT scores this summer and fall will be the only ones accepted for institutional scholarships that specific colleges offer. MOST students take the ACT test an average of 4-6 times. Most state colleges will start offering scholarships with an ACT of 25/26 and at least a 3.0/3.25 GPA.
