PLANNING: Senior Resume'

Due to English teachers before Fall Break!

- Have current contact information with <u>professional email</u> (formal name, intials, etc.-no slang/nicknames)
 - Sample on pages 14
 - Complete resume' outline ps. 15
- List GPA & ACT (optional)
- Use info. during high school/summers only.
- Note work and school/community volunteer experiences.
- Include clubs, activities, skills and hobbies.
- Highlight any awards you have earned while in high school.







PLANNING: Letters of Recommendation

 Identify teachers and/or counselor (Knight, Sisk, Baker) to write your LOR.

- Request a LOR ONLY if required by college or scholarship agency.
- Complete LOR request form in M212.
- Must have submitted a resume.
- Make LOR request at least 2 weeks ahead.

PLANNING: How to Make a Decision

- Complete self assessment.
 - Pages 8-13
- Have a "Realistic Conversation" with your parents.
- You have choices to consider (and combo of choices)
 - 4 Year College
 - 2 Year College

Look at your GPA & ACT scores



PROCESSING: College Search

- Use a college search sites such as www.niche.com , www.collegeboard.org
- Look at Admissions Req. for your top 3-5 schools (pgs. 19-20 & on college website). CHOOSE A VARIETY OF COLLEGES! Public, private, in-town, instate, out-of-state. Don't only choose private and out-of-state!!!
- If you have chosen a major, check to see that your schools offer that major.
- Complete the Grid on Page 31 for each school.
- Take a tour of each campus ASAP.
- Register through the college's website to receive important information (U of Mphs=True Blue Tiger, UT Knox=VIP).



PROCESSING: How Will You Measure Up?

REQUIREMENTS

All freshmen under 21 years of age must graduate with a regular diploma from an accredited or state approved high school or complete a GED.

All first-time freshmen applying for admission to the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga must meet one of the following high school grade point average and ACT/SAT combinations:

- 2.85 high school GPA (on a 4.0 scale) and a minimum 18 ACT composite (870 SAT composite).
- . Minimum 2.3 high school GPA (on a 4.0 scale) and a 21 ACT composite (990 SAT composite) minimum.

(Visit our catalog for full details regarding admissions regulations)

First-time freshmen must also have the following minimum unit requirements:

4 units of English

1 unit of European history, world history, or world geography

3 units of math (algebra I and II, and geometry)

2 units of the same foreign language

2 units of lab science

1 unit of visual or performing arts.

1 unit of American history

 - 2 yr Associate Degree > Transfer to 4 yr college (2yrs).
- Technical schools Entrance test in place of ACT.
 - TN College of Applied Technology*, page 23
 - * TN Promise \$ will cover tuition
- Military ASVAB on Sept. 23rd-(sign up Sept. 8), ROTC=ACT
 - Various programs listed on page 24
 - Military scholarships listed on page 24 & 40







PAYING: Types of Financial Aid

- Grants-Federal & State- (FAFSA- Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- Work Study (FAFSA)
- Scholarships
- Student Loans (FAFSA)



- What is FAFSA? The online application for Federal Pell grants, HOPE lottery, Fed. Loans
- Senior Parents Financial Aid Meeting September 12th 6-7pm in theatre
 - ALL Senior parents should attend!!
- Complete the FAFSA between Oct 1stst and January 17th 2016 (ASAP after Oct. 1st 2016)-
 - Do not complete BEFORE Oct. 1st!! You want the Fall 2017 application which goes online Oct. 1st!





PAYING: Scholarships

- National Scholarships-Free Online Searches (pg. 36)
- State Scholarships-
 - TN Promise (p40)- No ACT/GPA requirements.
 - TN HOPE (p53)- Must have 21 on ACT OR unweighted 3.0 G.P.A.
- Institutional Scholarships- All colleges offer these. Look on college website (TN public colleges on p38) Early ACT (Dec. is last one for institutional \$/Also watch Admissions deadlines!!)
- Bolton Scholarships (p36)

Two years of tuition-free community or technical college to Tennessee high school graduates. (pg. 40)
