ALL juniors should bring a photo ID for test day or you must get an ACT ID letter when the counselors come to your English class this Monday and Tuesday.

Remember this ACT score may be used for college admissions and scholarships, so please do your best and prepare for this test! ©

SENIORS- Please make sure that you are following up on important financial aid issues! 1. Your parent's 2016 tax information must be on your FAFSA and your parent needs to sign it or print a FAFSA Signature page.

- 2. Make sure all of your colleges are listed on your FAFSA. It is ideal to list the college that you want to attend as the first college (ex. Southwest should be listed first if you are using the TN Promise scholarship there.)
- 3. Once you are accepted to a college, make your college student portal and check your financial aid tab in this account. Each college will post a list of needed financial aid documents within your student portal. YOU must submit this information ASAP so the college can approve the financial aid that you will receive.
- 4. Many students who qualify for the Federal Pell Grant will be chosen for "Verification" so you will need to submit tax documents to the college before your Pell Grant will be processed. It is BEST to use the IRS Retrieval Tool on the FAFSA so the IRS will transfer your parent's tax info into your FAFSA. See Mrs. Warren if you have questions.
