FALL 2018 TIMELINE- Get ready for your Senior Year!

1. Mrs. Baker and Mrs. Warren will meet with seniors and discuss Senior Year Handbook (within first two weeks of school).
2. Each student will meet individually with a counselor and discuss the completed Summer Action Plan 2018 and completed pages in the Senior Handbook (meetings begin the third week of August and will be completed by mid-September).
3. Each senior will be given a Next Steps Checklist.
4. Seniors and Senior Parents will be encouraged to attend Senior Night and Financial Aid Night (both in September).
5. Seniors will begin college, TN Promise and other applications in August. Most college applications are online August 1st. The Common Application essay questions are online now so juniors may start writing these essays this summer! 8. VERY IMPORTANT-Have a realistic discussion with your parent/guardian about issues such as the financial demands of college, your academic record (ACT score, Grade point average) and the specific colleges, technical schools/apprenticeship programs or military branch that interests you.
9. Research 3-5 schools, become familiar with their websites and take campus visits as soon as possible. MAKE IT A PRIORITY TO VISIT CAMPUSES!! Start with in town schools such as U of Memphis, Christian Brothers, etc. Register for tours online!
 - a. Pick a variety of colleges (or Career technical schools)
 - i. In-town/local public college (ex. Univ. of Memphis or Southwest TN CC)
 - ii. In-state public (such as Austin Peay, UT Chattanooga/Martin/Knoxville, East TN State, TN State Univ., TN Technological Univ.)
 - iii. Private College (cost is same for in or out of state students) or Out-of state public
